II: Living Through the Unthinkable: A Student's Perspective

Reichen Posey shares his powerful story of surviving the Sandy Hook tragedy as a first grader. Now a young adult, he reflects on trauma, healing, and the lasting impact of that day. Reichen offers insights into what helped him recover, including community, mental health support, and family, while challenging us to prioritize both the physical and emotional safety of students.
